

Lots of information. I have a much better understanding of how card weaving works now. The book answered a few questions that I had not been able to find answers to on the web. The author takes you through three samplers, using these to teach important techniques. She also briefly mentions other things that can be learned in detail later from some other source once you have this foundation in card weaving. The only thing that I can think of to make this book better would be a large appendix or library of design charts for the beginning weaver to choose from.
