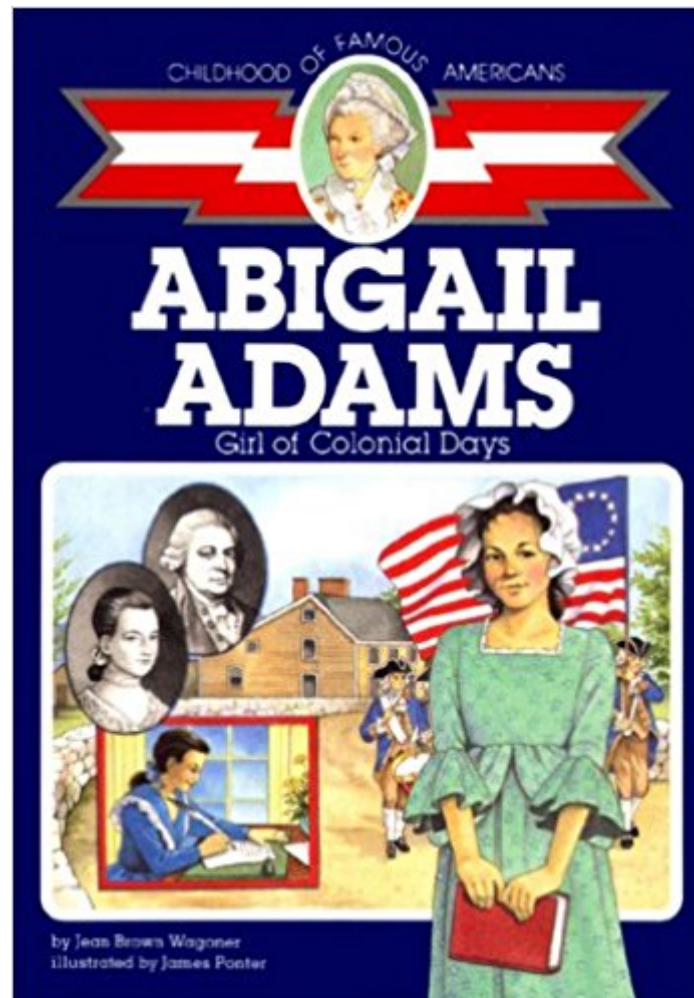




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Abigail Adams: Girl Of Colonial Days (Childhood Of Famous Americans)
