

Amazing story of one of the first great industrialists ever. Henry Ford was a true entrepreneur who understood extremely well the very fundamentals of business and industry. He expresses his ideas clearly and directly breaking paradigms of the time. It is surprising that still today his basic concepts are not widely accepted by some people. Worth read.

When I sat down to read this book I almost couldn't put it down. I was expecting a lot of writing about how Henry grew up, how he got involved in cars, and how he built his company. All of which I found in great detail and made for a fascinating read. What I didn't expect to find was how strong Henry's economic, political, and social ideals were. For instance, he prided himself on the fact that he made his company so efficient that he could readily employ blind people, deaf people, people with missing appendages, etc. And he could employ them at full wages because he found a way for them to provide valuable work. He also talked about how horrible he thought banking institutions had become and he also prided himself on building his company with profits only. He had lines of credit for efficiency reasons, but never took out loans, and always had sufficient cash on hand to pay off his lines of credit. (perhaps the owners of Ford today took a queue from Henry Ford by refusing to accept government bailout money?) All in all, this is a great book that I think everyone should read, but especially the leaders of our businesses and government should read. If our leaders had the same ideals as Henry Ford I am sure that everyone would benefit greatly!

A lot of good business and practical wisdom. Many of his speculative comments regarding the future were overly optimistic. Some couldn't be more incorrect. My biggest concern centered around statements regarding Jewish peoples; I am not knowledgeable about the events of his day, so it's difficult to comment appropriately. Having reminded myself of the age of the writing, I can look past the negatives and glean much.

Very interesting book that is Henry Ford's perspective on the topics address in the book. If you are interested in how he thought and the reasoning behind his actions, this is a great good to get. Another aspect of this book that I find fascinating is that several challenges that Henry Ford comments on in this book still exist to this day. Be it the reason for wages being what they are, how businesses are run and managed, and what industry can do for a country, there are a lot things that have not changed in almost 100 years since this book was written. A question I do have about this book is when was this writing completed by Henry Ford? How was this writing found and not published sooner.
