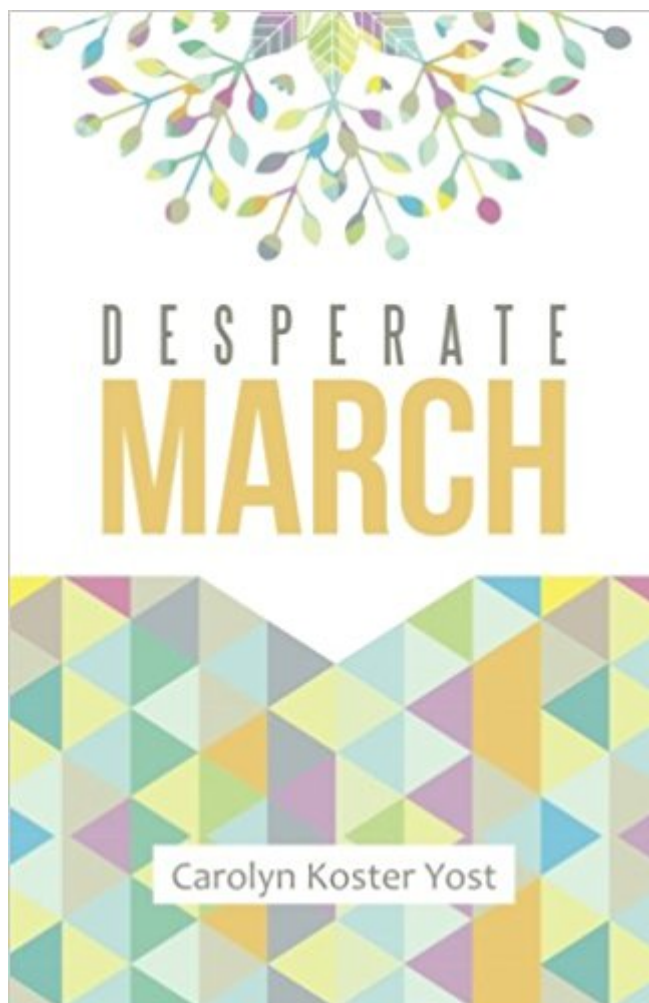


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Desperate March

This story about the Lost Boys of Sudan is so moving. We hear of terrible happenings in parts of the world that we can only imagine. These children had to endure the separation from their parents not knowing if they would ever see them again. Others were left as orphans when their parents were

brutally killed by enemies of the Sudan. Untold numbers of these children marched from their villages over a thousand miles, suffering every step of the way. Ms. Yost takes us with them through the eyes of a boy named Abraham. She has captured the pain and the endurance of the soul to go on against all odds.

I just finished reading *Desperate March* and found the story heart wrenching. The author relates the hardships of the young boys who lost homes and families during uprisings in Sudan. As the story moves along, the reader cannot put the book down due to worrying about what happened next to those poor children.. What they went through is beyond the imagination of people in many countries. I applaud Ms Yost for having the tenacity to enlighten the world about this atrocity. A well-written book that must be read with a tissue box nearby. I highly recommend it.
